### **Reflecting & Reaching**

What a difference a year can make! Reflecting on last year at this time, I was writing my first newsletter article as Executive Director, we had just begun the renovation of our new space and had four new staff members. Reaching forward to where we are now, I am grateful for this amazing team and proud of all of the good that has happened.

2022 was a year of tremendous growth and transformation. 2023 will be a year of managing that growth, refining processes and evaluating outcomes. Already in February, we implemented a new way for neighbors to shop in our Market food shelf. Instead of following a prescribed shopping list based on family size, neighbors now shop by a color-system where the color will show them how many items they can select from that section based on family size. It is easier to understand for neighbors who speak different languages and it provides more choice for families to select items they know their families will enjoy, which also reduces waste. The efficiency of the new process allows HFS to double the number of people we serve in the Market to every half hour instead of every hour.

Additionally, our expansion of food rescue allows HFS to fill our Market on the Move van with fresh produce to take to a senior living community each week instead of one per month. See page 6 to see the tremendous growth in services over the past year! There is still more to do, but we are also taking a breath to make sure that we are working efficiently and effectively so we can provide the greatest impact for the people we serve and for our community.

I've heard it takes a village... I say it takes a FAMILY! I am grateful to be part of this HFS FAMILY of volunteers, staff, donors, neighbors and community partners with you.

### **IRA Contributions**

If you need to take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from an IRA, consider sending it directly to a qualified nonprofit like HFS to reduce your taxable income. Keeping your taxable income lower can reduce the impact to your Social Security and Medicare. Starting in 2023, the age requirement for RMD increases to 73 years. Contact your financial advisor to determine if this is a good option for you!





# Celebrating a Year of Growth & Hope




Demand for a 7 - 10 day supply of food increased by 52%, from 979 households in 2021 to 1,491 households in 2022.

### **Total Pounds of Food**




HFS increased the total amount of food given out to families by 34%, from 270,529 lbs of food in 2021 to 362,768 lbs on food in 2022.




Emergency Grants to neighbors doubled, from 93 grants in 2021 to 193 grants in 2022.

Just Friends became fully operational in 2022 and rides nearly tripled, from 483 rides in 2021 to 1,281 rides.

### **Meals on Wheels**



Meals on Wheels delivery increased by 9.5%, from 14,016 meals delivered in 2021 to 15,331 in 2022.
